What qualifications do I need to start?

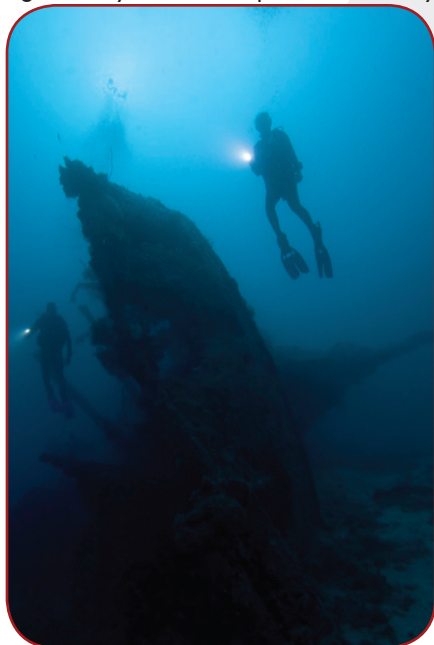
You will need to be an Advanced Open Water certified diver in order to enroll in the Wreck Diver Specialty Course.

What will I do?

The course includes four open water dives located along southern California's coastal waters. You will start off with an orientation dive which involves mapping a wreck. You will also learn proper procedures for wreck penetration while using a wreck reel. The course will cover equipment used for wreck diving and the hazards/safety procedures of wreck diving. The dives are usually over two days and are conducted from a dive boat. This course also counts towards your Master Scuba Diver 5 Specialties!

How long will it take?

The Wreck Diver course consists of an orientation followed by two days of diving, usually on two adjacent Saturdays.



What will I need?

- PADI Wreck diver pack, or book
- PIC Certification Card
- Boat passes not included in course fee
- Scuba rentals are available for 1/2 price
